The Office of the Attorney General and 100 LLC, the company which organized the 2014 Charleston, West Virginia, Dirty Girl Mud Run, have reached an agreement whereby sufficient funds have been provided to the Office of the Attorney General to provide refunds to any registrants who have not yet received full reimbursement of their registration fees. In addition to providing this funding, as part of its overall resolution of issues surrounding the cancelled Dirty Girl Mud Run, 100 LLC has made a donation to the West Virginia Chapter of the Susan G. Komen Foundation in an amount of \$20,000.

The Office of the Attorney General will begin mailing letters to individuals identified as registrants who may not have yet received a refund the week of September 28, 2015.

In order to claim your refund you will need to provide the following information to the Office of the Attorney General:

1. Full name;
2. current mailing address where a check can be sent;
3. contact phone number;
4. proof of registration;
5. the names of any other registrants for whom you paid a registration fee;
6. amount due to be refunded;
7. proof of payment (credit card statement indicating charge, or other similar documentation); and,
8. an affirmation that you personally paid the registration fee and the amount has not previously been refunded, reimbursed, or otherwise forgiven.

You may request your refund by providing the necessary information and documentation by mail to: Office of the Attorney General, Consumer Protection Division, P.O. Box 1789, Charleston, WV 25326-1789 or by downloading and submitting a claim submission form on our website at www.wvago.gov beginning October 1, 2015.

All requests for refunds must be received by the Office of the Attorney General on or before December 31, 2015.
