Dear Mr. Morris:

We have read the Texas Attorney General's Limited Objection to Debtor's Sale of Consumers' Personally Identifiable Information for 117 million consumers nationwide. Based on the objection filed by Texas, RadioShack seeks to sell consumers' private information, including names, phone numbers, mailing addresses, email addresses, and in some instances, activity data. This is information that consumers likely provided in reliance on the express privacy assurances that RadioShack made.

The Consumer Protection Division of the West Virginia Attorney General's Office shares Texas' concern that RadioShack Corporation's sale of consumers' Personally Identifiable Information is contrary to the representations the company made to consumers in its privacy policies. Such a misrepresentation would violate the West Virginia Consumer Credit & Protection Act, W. Va. Code §§ 46A-1-101, *et seq.*, which defines unfair or deceptive acts or practices to include "the act, use or employment by any person of any deception, fraud, false pretense, false promise or misrepresentation, or the concealment, suppression or omission of any material fact with intent that others rely upon such concealment, suppression or omission, in connection with the sale or advertisement of any goods or services, whether or not any person has in fact been misled, deceived, or damaged thereby." W. Va. Code § 46A-6-102(M) (2014).

Based on the foregoing, the Consumer Protection Division of the West Virginia Attorney General's Office agrees with Texas' objection to Debtors' Combined Motion for Entry of Orders (I) Establishing Bidding and Sale Procedures; (II) Approving the Sale of Asset; and (III) Granting Related Relief (Docket No. 36), pursuant to which the Debtors seek to sell numerous assets, including consumers' Personally Identifiable Information.


